Sub: People's concerns in India/UK for taking immediate action to address the Climate Crisis at the UN COP 26

Dear Honorable Ambassador-Ji:

As the Prime Minister is coming to Scotland for the COP 26 Summit, we wanted to express the concern of many people in India and UK for immediate steps towards regulating greenhouse gas emissions to save future generations. This has been put in an open letter to the Prime Minister, which you will find attached.

In continuation of many padyatras carried out in India in late September, Pushpanath Krishnamurthy, one of our associates began his march from London to Glasgow on October 2nd to the COPP 26. Before reaching Scotland on the 31st October, Pushpanath Krishnamurthy has heard from more than 5000 people in different cities and towns across the UK, who are calling for a Climate Emergency. Pushpanath Krishnamurthy has used a 30-day march in the UK to show the wisdom of Gandhi of "living simply so others can simply live". Each day, he has repeatedly mentioned that people can begin at home and make the changes necessary for curbing

environmental catastrophe. If this is also met with the appropriate international/national policies, genuine change for greater sustainability is possible.

We hope that these discussions at the COP 26 Summit are met with success. It is a historic moment to prevent catastrophic consequences for future generations.
